Grousemount Project: Turbine Delivery



Turbine deliveries to the wind farm will begin in March 2019. To avoid local traffic disruption transport lorries will deliver the components during the early morning hours (typically 11.00pm to 6.00am). These deliveries will leave Ringaskiddy Port, Cork on Monday morning to Friday morning for a period of approximately 6 months.

The convoy of 4 Mar-Train trucks will be escorted under Garda assistance via Macroom, Ballymakeera, Ballyvourney, and travel towards to the county boundary where the trucks will turn to access the new temporary bridge over the Sullane at the Mills.

From the Mills, the convoy will travel through Cúil Aodha village and up to Top of Coom and onward to Grousemount Wind Farm site.







Wind farm construction works update.

• At the beginning of **February 2019**, there are 23 turbine base pours complete, 15 pours remain to be constructed over the coming weeks.




- Ducting installation works are complete over c.30km from the new Coomataggart 110kV station to Ballyvouskill 220 kV station, however some remedial works remain to be completed in **February**
- Duct proofing and cable pulling and joining has commenced from the Top of Coom to Ballyvourney. Traffic management is in place for cable installation work.
- Turbine delivery route modification works are ongoing and will be complete ahead of turbine delivery in **March**.
- Turbine component delivery will commence in **March**. Followed by Turbine erection on site.
- The substation site works are substantially complete with remaining station fit out and cable connections to each turbine location.
